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



fig. 9 "Scaffolding & Centering", How to Build a Cathedral, Hislop, Malcolm, p135




fig 15 - detail drawing excerpt from Goodhue Associates October 5, 1926






fig. 16 - shop drawings from Quastavino Fireproof Const. Co. August 13, 1928 an interlocking tile vault system used Grand Central, Ellis Island, Carnegie Hal, among many other noted structures across the country from 1898-1962


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




fig 7) Process Diagram Source: SD Peaslee, RA


